- 20 accuracy of the machines instead of counting the
- 21 ballots.

- 25 that. It's just that with leaving out specific subsets

- 1 of the total, you end up with the potential, especially
- 2 because those subsets would tend to swing one way or the
- 3 other, that your machine may not be catching certain
- 4 types of voting accurately.
- 5 REGISTRAR REPRESENTATIVE 2: I totally hear
- 6 what you're saying.
- 7 RAY LUTZ: And since state law does say it's
- 8 one percent, if you're not doing one percent, you're not
- 9 really following the law.
